

FIRE CHIEF'S DESK

BURN PERMITS: Please, before you burn go to the Courtland Township website fill out the burn permit. Please apply for one or two days at a time. Remember, all burning must be done during daylight hours, and burning should be a safe distance from all buildings, tall grass and trees. Do not leave fires **WINTER 2023**

unattended and have a garden hose handy. Burning of tires, roofing, construction materials, treated lumber, garbage, plastics, rubber or petroleum products is prohibited.



Please change your batteries in your Smoke Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Detectors. Test them every month by pushing the test button on them. Did you know you should replace the entire smoke detector every ten years? We

have free smoke detectors at the Township Hall and Fire Station. If you have the wired together detectors and need to replace them, buy new ones and we will come over and replace them for you for free. Just call Chief at 616-813-2961.

911 Emergency Address Signs-If you or a loved one is having a medical emergency it is very difficult for us to respond to your house quickly with no address out by the road. Even in subdivisions it is very hard for us to see the address on your house. We have the Green & White reflective address signs available for \$10.00. Call the Township office to order. If you do not have one of these address signs, please have your address on both sides of your mailbox.

With Winter season on the way please do not have portable heaters plugged into extension cord or have them too close to any flammables. When we have power outages, please do not run portable generators inside garages or enclosed porches, the C.O. can kill you.

Keep your Christmas trees watered and candles away from them. After Christmas you may drop off real, undecorated, unbagged trees for recycling behind the Courtland Fire Station #1 at 7480 14 Mile Rd.

COURTLAND TOWNSHIP MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Planning Commission has been working hard on the development of the master plan and is currently reviewing the first draft. Thank you to those who took the community survey and attended the open house last winter! The draft master plan will be posted on the Township website in the near future and public comments are welcome!

The master plan covers topics like housing, roads, trails, parks, reservation of natural resources, and farms. It's a road map for future land use decisions for Township officials! For more information or discussion regarding the plan, please contact the Township or consider attending a future Planning Commission meeting.

CLERK'S NOTES

The Special Election held on November 7th, 2023 was very slow. Out of the 7,630 registered voters in Courtland Township only 1,776 (23.28%) votes were cast. Of those 1,776 votes cast, 1,302 (73.31%) were from Absentee Ballots, leaving 474 (26.68%) in-person votes.

Proposal 22-2, which passed last November, mandates that voters have the right to 9 days of early voting, in addition to, the traditional voting on election day. All qualified electors in Courtland Township will be able to come into the Early Voting Site at the Courtland Township Hall, mark a ballot, and deposit it in a tabulator. The Early Voting Site hours are 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. Early voting is only required for State and Federal Elections. Early Voting will begin on Saturday, February 17, 2024 and end on Sunday, February 25, 2024 for the February 27, 2024 Presidential Primary.

Another change with the passing of Proposal 22-2 is the Permanent Absent Voting Ballot List (PAVBL). If the voter chooses, they will automatically receive a ballot for each election they are eligible to vote in. The Permanent Absent Voter Application list is being phased out. If you wish to be placed on the PAVBL simply visit https://mvic.sos. state.mi.us/ and sign up.

The Polls will open as usual on Tuesday, February 27, 2024 at 7:00 am and will close at 8:00 pm.

Michigan is the only state in the Union that has trifecta voting – 9 days of Early Voting (Early Voting Site), Absentee Ballots (mailin) and in-person regular polling locations on election day.
